This week a United States Circuit Court of Appeals ruled that Brett Kavanaugh, Donald Trump's nominee to the Supreme Court, must respond to charges brought by multiple women that he sexually assaulted them when they were in high school. In making its decision, the Court said that Kavanaugh was "almost certain" to be denied a place on the Supreme Court because of the sexual assault allegations. Kavanaugh has denied all the charges of sexual assault. And in doing so he has pledged to testify under oath to the Senate. (He has since refused to respond to requests from multiple women to do so.) The fact that he might actually testify under oath is what has sparked more public discussion about his nomination and got the media to report on the allegations. "The most unexpected case in a Supreme Court nomination is always the one in which the nominee is dragged into the spotlight and forced to defend himself or herself in public," writes David Graham in The Atlantic. "Only if Kavanaugh is brought up, for the first time, in the Senate Judiciary Committee's hearing on the nomination can the world's most important and least-known court, the US Supreme Court, begin to know who he is. 82157476af
